

Objectives for Week #14

- Determine the specific type of fiber (natural or synthetic) present in the evidence.
- Identifying whether a fiber is cotton, wool, polyester, nylon, etc., helps narrow down potential sources and provides initial leads in an investigation.
- Compare fibers from a crime scene with fibers from a suspect's clothing or belongings.
- Establishing a match or similarity between fibers can link a suspect to the crime scene or victim.







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
